Today's speaker was Dr. Fred Snoy - Urology Group of New Mexico



Doctor Snoy wasn't always a doctor. He grew up in Indiana; Indianapolis to be specific. Fred's father was an Mechanical Engineer and Hospital Administrator; his mother was a school teacher at the Indiana School For the Blind; and his sister is a retired ophthalmologist. Mr. Snoy also has two sons. The eldest has a Masters' Degree in Engineering and works at Sandia; the youngest has a Masters Degree in Computer Science and works locally, producing nationally recognized Education Programs and Models for drilling rigs. A young Fred Snoy attended Regis College in Denver, where he earned a Bachelors Degree in Biology; and a deep interest in skiing. He returned to Indiana long enough to get a MA degree from Indiana State University and a medical degree from Indiana University School of Medicine. Indiana, however is a relatively hill-free zone, and, in spite of his advanced education, the now Doctor Fred Snoy, was still very interested in propelling himself down ice covered mountains on two wooden planks. To get closer to that action, he came to Albuquerque for his medical residency...and this upcoming July 15th, will celebrate his 30th year anniversary as a Urologist. He started out as a single practitioner, then as the work increased, expanded to a point where there were 6 Urologists in his group. Over time, the medical industry changed, and the group dwindled back down to one member - but it was the most important member. Dr. Fred Snoy MD. FACS continues his urology practice. He has a special interest in oncology, particularly prostate cancer, kidney stones, incontinence and impotence. Expanding on an interest that he developed back in residency, Dr. Snoy is also involved in clinical studies. These studies are an interesting and quite necessary component for advancements in medical treatments. The process develops the data that is important for determining a medication's safety and usefulness; and ultimately to gain FDA approval. The studies have the additional benefits of providing subject patients with an opportunity to try medicines that are not available to the general public; and giving other patients an access to newer medicines. The amount of data needed for the analysis requires that the studies last from a month, to more than a year, and Dr. Snoy's involvement through the coordination of medicine companies, doctors and patients has helped bring many of the medications now available to urology patients through the FDA approval process.
