- ♦ Euclidean geometry was named after Euclid, a Greek mathematician who lived in 300 BC. His book, called "The Elements", is a collection of axioms, theorems and proofs about squares, circles acute angles, isosceles triangles, and other such things. Most of the theorems which are taught in high schools today can be found in Euclid's 2000 year old book.¹ There are less common types of geometry like Spherical, Hyperbolic and the infamous, Taxi-Cab Geometry.

Friday, November 11th is Veterans Day. It is “..an official United States public holiday, observed annually on November 11, that honors military veterans, that is, persons who served in the United States Armed Forces. It coincides with other holidays, including Armistice Day and Remembrance Day, celebrated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I; major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. The United States previously observed Armistice Day. The U.S. holiday was renamed Veterans Day in 1954.”¹

In the United States, a Veterans Day National Ceremony is held each year on November 11th at Arlington National Cemetery . The ceremony commences precisely at 11:00 a.m. with a wreath laying at the Tomb of the Unknowns and continues inside the Memorial Amphitheater with a parade of colors by veterans' organizations and remarks from dignitaries. The ceremony is intended to honor and thank all who served in the United States Armed Forces.

Veterans Parade and Memorial Ceremony in Albuquerque

There will be a parade featuring restored military vehicles that begins at 9 a.m. on Veteran's Day, November 11. The parade begins at Bullhead Park on south San Pedro, then moves northwest past the Veterans Hospital onto Ridgecrest. The parade will continue east along Gibson to Louisiana, where it will turn north and head to Veterans Memorial Park at 1100 Louisiana NE. At 10 a.m., there will be a musical prelude, and at 11 a.m., a ceremony will ensue. The speaker will be Colonel Tim Hale, USAF (Ret), Cabinet Secretary of the NM Department of Veterans Services. Park at the Kirtland Federal Credit Union at Louisiana and Gibson. Shuttles will be available.

Angel Fire Vietnam Veterans Memorial Park

A Veterans Day ceremony will take place at 11 a.m. at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Park in Angel Fire.

Santa Fe Veterans Parade and Ceremony

A Veterans Day parade will begin at 10:30 am from Murales Road to the Bataan Building. There will also be a Veterans Day ceremony that will begin at 11 am.
